SCHOOL GRADUATION POLICY FOR ABUDHABI INDIAN SCHOOL

INTRODUCTION

Abu Dhabi Indian School, which is a premier community school in the Gulf is providing a world-class education to a culturally diverse student community aged 3 to 15 years old. The school graduate students after the All India School Senior Certificate Exam at the end of Grade 12 based on CBSE curriculum.

PURPOSE

To identify requirements for graduation at Abu Dhabi Indian School.

SCOPE

This policy applies to all students seeking graduation from Abu Dhabi Indian School.

POLICY STATEMENT

The Central Board for Secondary Education (CBSE) has established minimum standards for graduation from any CBSE Affiliated school. In addition to the requirements guide lined by CBSE, students should meet the requirements specified by Abu Dhabi Educational Council for the Ministry Subjects in order for graduation. Any student who meet both these requirements shall be awarded the appropriate high school degree as specified in the CBSE regulations.

RESPONSIBILITY

The Principal is responsible for administering this policy.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To graduate from the school, students must meet the minimum standards established $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right)$

by the Central Board of Secondary Education and Abu Dhabi Education Council as follows:

In Class 12, Subjects will fall under 2 categories.

- Group A Ministry Subjects
 - Islamic Studies

Arabic

➤ Group B - Regular Subjects based on CBSE Curriculum

To graduate from Class 12, students must study one of the following combination of subjects and attain the required credits as per CBSE regulations.

- English, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology
- English, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science
- English, Psychology, Physics, Chemistry, Biology
- English, Accountancy, Business Studies, Economics, Informatics Practices
- English, Accountancy, Business Studies, Economics, Sociology
- English, Accountancy, Business Studies, Economics, Psychology
- English, Accountancy, Business Studies, Economics, Mathematics

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR MINISTRY SUBJECTS

S. No	Subject	Min m <mark>ark</mark>	Max mark	Classes
1	Islamic Studies	60	100	Compulsory for Muslims of classes 11 &12 and optional for non-Muslim.
2	Arabic	60	100	Compulsory for equivalency purpose for classes 11 & 12 as per Article 46 of the new regulation for Private Schools.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR CBSE SUBJECTS

For CBSE Subjects in Class 12, Results will be declared by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi, India.

Maximum marks of all subjects of this group are (100) and minimum is (33%).

- Student should study five subjects, and he/she should attain 33% in all the five subjects.
- A student has to attain 33% separately in Theory and Practical in subjects having theory and practical examinations.
- Grades will be given on 9 point scale as specified by CBSE.

Grades: A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2, D

After the evaluation of papers of the Board Exam, CBSE will prepare a student mark list in the descending order of their marks.

For. Eg:-

(No of Students attended the Exam - No. of Failures) / 8 = 'x'

Then in the Student Mark list, the first 'x' students will be given Grade A1, the next 'x' students will be given Grade A2, and so on.

Students who score less than 33% will be given Grade D, which means "Failed".

ADJUSTMENT OF GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- A student has the right to re-sit for the exam, if he has attained less than 33% only in one subject out of the total of five subjects.
- ➤ If the student scores marks less than the 33% mark in two or more subjects, he/she is considered as detained.
