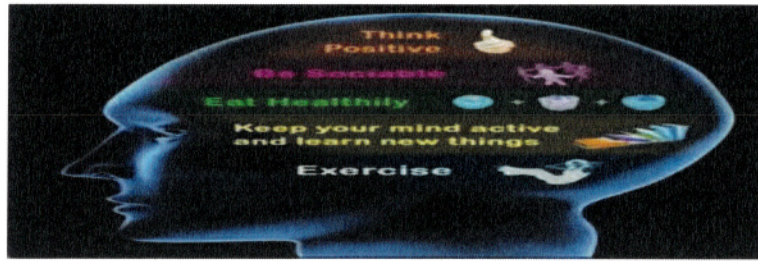

INTERNATIONAL ASSESSMENTS

International Olympiads

International Olympiad Foundation conducted Olympiads in various subjects for Grades 1-12. Aiza Mariam of 6B, made the school and UAE proud by winning a Bronze medal in the 19th International Mathematics and Science Olympiad (IMSO) held on 29th Nov – 4th Dec 2022

In the year 2022-23, a total of 719 students participated in the Olympiads. While 51 students were placed in the Top 10 Ranks in the UAE, 17 students bagged the top 3 ranks in UAE for various subjects.

Sastra Pratibha Contest

Shastra Pratibha Contest (SPC) is India's largest Science Talent Search Contest organized by Vijnana Bharati. 6 students, from Grades 6 – 12, represented the school at the Final Round of the contest conducted in Dec 2022.

International Benchmark Test – Arabic

International Benchmark Test in Arabic Language measures proficiency in Arabic Reading, Grammar, Spelling and Vocabulary through a variety of texts and situations with multiple-choice questions and is based on the Arabic Curriculum provided by the Ministry of Education.

125 students across Grades 3-10 appeared for IBT Arabic exam. 3 students received the ‘Distinction Certificate’, 4 students received ‘High Distinction Certificate’ and 5 students received ‘Honour Certificate’.

Standardized Benchmark Assessment – ASSET

ASSET Exam was conducted in school as part of ADEK’s Standardized Benchmark Assessment Policy. This assessment checks the depth of students’ understanding in every topic for subjects English, Math, Science, Hindi and Social Studies. 2672 students across Grades 3-10 appeared for the initial round of assessment. 476 students from Grades 4-8 were selected to the second round, ASSET TALENT SEARCH. 12 students won the ‘Gold Scholar

Award', 7 students won the 'Silver Scholar Award' and 5 students won the 'Bronze Scholar Award'.

Sidharth P Suresh of Grade 12 represented India at the 9th Iranian Geometry Olympiad conducted by the Homi Bhabha Centre for Science Education, Mumbai on October 14th, 2023.

He was selected to appear for the Indian National Mathematical Olympiad (INMO) conducted by the Homi Bhabha Centre for Science Education, Mumbai on January 15th, 2023.

He was also selected to represent India at the 35th Asian Pacific Mathematical Olympiad held on March 14th, 2023.

University of Waterloo Competitions

Centre for Education in Mathematics and Computing at the University of Waterloo conducts Math competitions annually for students of Grades 9 to 12. CEMC contests are challenging but attainable activities for young learners, they also build students' confidence in their ability to tackle difficult problems — a key ingredient for student success both inside and outside the classroom.

Canadian Intermediate Math Contest: 5 students appeared for the exam and Preet Pannu of 10 D received the Distinction Medal.

Canadian Senior Math Contest: 8 students appeared for the exam and Rujul Malhotra of 12 A received the Distinction Medal.

Euclid Contest: 2 students appeared for the exam and Utkarsh Gupta of 12 C received the Distinction medal.

Cognitive Abilities Test (CAT4)

CAT4 Assessment assesses students' verbal, non-verbal, quantitative and spatial reasoning skills which helps to understand the academic potential and thinking preferences. The Assessment was conducted for Grades 3 to 9 and 2630 students appeared for the assessment conducted in June 2022.

PISA

Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) Main Study was conducted on May 28th, 2022. PISA measures students' literacy in reading, science, mathematics, creative thinking and financial literacy. 53 students from Grade 9 and 10 appeared for the test conducted in May 2022.

TIMSS

Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study Program (TIMSS) evaluates student performance in Mathematics and Science in Grades 4 and 8. 54 students from Grade 8 and 60 students from Grade 4 appeared for the assessment conducted in March 2023.

SAFAL

Structured Assessment for Analysing Learning (SAFAL) is a competency based assessment initiated by CBSE for students of Grades 3, 5 and 8. 377 students of Grade 8 and 387 students of Grade 5 took part in the PILOT Study of SAFAL conducted in February 2023.
